

## **Preferential voting:**

- Multi turn system
- At each turn the candidate who has the least first choices is **eliminated**. Another turn is made without taking them into account. And so forth, until there is **only one left**.
- In the example, if candidate C is eliminated, the first choice will be candidate A.




- Officials are elected with a tworound runoff voting system
- All citizens above 18yrs registered on electoral rolls can vote
  - Voting by proxy is possible
    - Not compulsory
- Laws are only proposed by government (law project) or MPs (law propositions)
  - 15% are law propositions
- Referendums are rare
- European Union initiative



## **Popular Initiative:**

Possibility given to the people to ask for a referundum to change the Constitution

## **KEY FIGURES**

- **198** Federal initiatives were submitted to vote **between 1891** and 2015
- Almost 90% of the initiatives which were submitted to vote did not pass

To implement these ideas we need to change the French Constitution and create new laws.




Means	Is it realistic?
Citizen petition	Not an online petition You have to depose the 500 000 signatures on paper
Shared Initiative Referendum	Complicated conditions => signatures of 185 MPs and 4,6 million signatures
Reform of the Constitution	The President or the National Assembly can submit for voting a revision of the Constitution
European Citizen Initiative	Need 1 million signatures among at least 7 countries of EU + minimum number of signatures in each of the 7 countries
